

SOLID STEEL

Solid Steel is a leading UK-based steel band comprised of some of the finest steel pan players produced since the instrument was first introduced here in the 50s. One of those early pioneers was Max Cherrie and it's his son, Paul, who founded the band 20 years ago. The first steel band featuring primarily British musicians of Caribbean parentage, it is now established as perhaps the hardest working of its kind in the UK today.

Its reputation has been enhanced with each passing year by an impressive variety of work that includes television, radio and a busy touring schedule that has seen them perform throughout Europe, Africa, Asia, and the Middle East. The band's latest CD *Three* was released in spring of 2008 and was conceived as a tribute to the small genre from which it comes and to those that pioneered it. That genre is the all-acoustic three piece steel band or 'steel trio' as it is better known.

TRIO MANOUCHE

Trio Manouche are one of the UK's leading gypsy swing ensembles, performing inspired reworked classics of Django Reinhardt in addition to highly acclaimed original material penned by their band leader Simon Harris, bringing a unique and contemporary twist to this ever popular genre.

Since forming in 2005, the trio have performed in top Jazz venues, including Ronnie Scott's and 606 Club, concert halls from Kings Place to Barbican Hall and major UK festivals including Glastonbury, Secret Garden Party, The Mostly Jazz Festival and Shambala Festival.

The trio currently have a residency at 606 Club and Le Quecumbar London, have just released their first EP Fall In Love With Swing, reaching n°3 in the online bandcamp charts, and are also regular guest performers on various BBC Radio shows including a recent performance and interview on Radio 3's In Tune.
