



PAEDIATRIC CRITICAL CARE

OVERVIEW

This one-day course is approved by the National Association of Medical Simulation and provides practical training relevant to common paediatric emergencies, including principles of airway management, fluid and drug therapy. Along with reinforcing principles of APLS, the course addresses multiple organ support in critically ill children via hands-on management of a hi-fidelity paediatric patient simulator having an acute event, in real time.

OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course participants will have a greater awareness of:

- The principles of good practice and guidelines in paediatric critical care
- The application of acute care knowledge and skills in the management of the critically ill child in a realistic environment
- The non-technical skills needed for successful crisis resolution in a multi-disciplinary team.
