# Let's get it right!

We want to make the hospital **fully accessible** to all of our patients.

We have set up a **Learning Disability Flag** system.

This will be kept on our electronic hospital record system under the **Disability Log**.

This information will **help us look after you** when you come to see us

All staff will be able to see this information.

This means you **should not have to tell us** about your needs over and over again.

# What is the Flag?

The Learning Disability Flag will be part of your hospital records and will tell all staff that you have a learning disability.

### It will have a list of your important needs. For example:

- I have light sensitive epilepsy
- I am non-verbal but pictures help me
- I need a quiet space

## What do we need to know?

### Things that you like, for example:

- What I like to be called
- I need a changing place for personal care

#### Things that you do not like for example:

- Do not touch me without permission
- Crowded and loud spaces
- Not being told what is happening
- Not to be kept waiting a long time

#### Support needed:

- Please let us know if you will be bringing a carer with you when attending appointments
- Please provide your carer's contact details
- We can provide hospital volunteers to assist you with appointments

# What happens next?

- If you would like the Learning Disability Flag set up for you, please speak to the nurse/manager in charge of the area you are attending
- They can help you decide what should be in the Learning Disability Flag
- You will be given a printed copy of the information
- Any further questions please contact the Lead Nurse (contact details on page 6)

# What if my needs change?

 If you want to change any of the information that we have about you, please let the department that you are currently attending know





- They will update your Learning Disability Flag for you
